Entries must be made at the Secretary's Office beginning **Monday, July 21st** and ending at 4:00 p.m. on **Monday, August 4th, 2025**.

There will be two separate flower shows during the fair to provide a continuous display of fresh flowers. **Exhibitors may enter either or both shows.**

Exhibitors must show pass to bring entries through the gates to bring flowers in to Flower Building.

Entries for the FIRST SHOW must be in place between 8:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m., Tuesday, August 19th and removed after 8:30 p.m. Thursday, August 21st.

Entries for the SECOND SHOW must be placed between 8:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m., Friday, August 22nd.

The building will close at 5:45 p.m. on Sunday, August 24th. Exhibits may be removed after 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 24th, **NO EARLY REMOVALS.**

Judging will be at noon on the day of entry for both shows.

1. The Flower Show Committee may remove inappropriate exhibits.
2. Judging will be by accredited judges from the Ohio Association of Garden Clubs, Inc.
3. Judging session is open to floriculture exhibitors. Questions may be taken by judges after judging is completed. The judge's decision is final.

All Garden Clubs are eligible to enter in the Garden Club categories. Please contact the director for more information.

**STANDARDS FOR JUDGING
Points of Specimen flowers and foliage**

- 25 pts Form - Perfection of form for type of flower
- 15 pts. Color - Clear, rich, luminous color
- 20 pts. Substance - Firm, Crisp petals
- 10 pts. Size of Flower - Typical for variety
- 20 pts. Stem - Strong straight stem, length in proportion to size of bloom
- 10 pts. Grooming and Disbudding

Special Awards

The following points will be awarded in both shows for horticulture and artistic classes. Blue ribbon – 5, Red ribbon – 3, White ribbon – 1 (No points to Garden Club Entries)

All previous award winners are eligible for 2025 awards. Awards are sponsored by Hayes Garden Club, Plant 'n' Bloom Garden Club, We'd Wackers Garden Club, Whispering Meadows Garden Club, and the Sandusky-Ottawa Master Gardeners.

FLORICULTURE RULES

1. Unless otherwise noted, an exhibitor may make more than one entry in each lot provided each entry is a different variety and labeled.
2. Class 2 Plants, an exhibitor may enter only one exhibit per lot.
3. Each variety **MUST BE IDENTIFIED** on entry tag in order to earn the Best of Show.
4. The exhibitor must grow all floriculture entries. Container grown exhibits must have been in exhibitor's possession at least three months.
5. All foliage must be attached. It should be clean with no evidence of spray residue, mildew or insect damage. No foreign substance permitted on foliage.
6. All "one bloom" exhibits must be disbudded. (Disbudding is removing bud side shoots as the specimen develops)
7. **Stem length should be cut in proportion to the size of the bloom.** Wedges (i.e., Saran Wrap, Styrofoam, Wood) may be used to hold the exhibit at the correct pose.
8. Fair Board provides vases, or you may use clear glass bottles. **No colored bottles.** No pop bottles.
9. Lots may be withdrawn, combined, or divided if the number of entries warrant. Exhibits not meeting the specifications of the schedule will be disqualified.

ARTISTIC DESIGN RULES

1. Exhibitors may enter as many classes as they desire but only one entry per lot.
2. All fresh plant material may be from any source and must be arranged by the exhibitor. Accessories are permitted.
3. No artificial or silk plant material permitted, except Class 9 Silk Flowers. Painted or artificially colored fresh plant material is never permitted.
4. Class 9 lots 1- 4 will be silk floral arrangements.
5. Bleached, treated (glycerin etc.) and dried material may be used unless otherwise stated.
6. Painted, dried, line material may be used in Creative designs.
7. On a separate 3 x 5 card list plant material used in the design and your interpretation of the title Place the card next to the design.
8. All "Choice" designs must be labeled with the floral design classification the exhibitor is using.

FLORAL DESIGN CLASSIFICATIONS

All floral designs can be classified as either Traditional (naturalistic, geometric, including Oriental, European and early 20th century designs) or creative designs (contemporary and abstract)

CREATIVE DESIGN incorporates space within and usually shows restraint in the amount of plant material and the number of components used.

TRADITIONAL DESIGN may be classified as line, line mass, or mass. Line designs exhibit lines as the most important feature and plant material is sparse. Line-mass designs incorporate both line using branches, stems or a series of blooms or leaves in a skeletal pattern; massing is along the main line, heavier toward the center and tapering along the outside edges. Mass design emphasizes a large mass of flowers with fullness and a minimum of voids.

An **INTERPRETIVE DESIGN** is the designers' own feeling idea, or translation of the class title to be depicted from the flower show schedule. The design could be traditional, creative, or abstract. If not stated, it is the designer's choice.

6. All watering is to be done by the exhibitor, but before the noon judging.

THEME: More Buckets of Flowers

Include index card listing flowers and leaves and your interpretation of title.

1. **"Lunch Bucket" NOVICE CLASS.** (Your choice of design; must list flowers and leaves on index card.) Include Lunch bucket as container. **NOVICE CLASS is for new designers or exhibitors who have not earned 2 blue ribbons at previous fairs.**
2. **"Bucket of Happiness"**– (Illuminary Design) An Illuminary Design is a creative design incorporating light(s) as one of the components. The lighting must be an integral part of the design, not something added for the sole purpose of including lights. Mechanics of special lighting such as wires, batteries, etc., must be concealed within bases, and/or containers, or in the background, underlay or other components. These designs are not to be confused with those where spotlights are used to enhance the overall design. Emphasis is placed on color, pattern, and balance. Design may or may not be abstract.
3. **"Champagne Bucket"** (Traditional Mass Design) A traditional Mass Design emphasizes a large mass of flowers rather than the individual flower heads. It always has fullness and a minimum of voids. It may be very compact or loose, open and airy. Shape should resemble geometric form such as cylinder, cone, sphere, pyramid, or oval with few voids.
4. **"Bucket Hat"** - (Choice) Using Orange, Red-Orange, and Yellow Orange.
5. **"Empty the Bucket"** (Creative Framed Spatial) Designed as a single unit, suspended in a frame-like structure not to exceed 3 square feet. Movement is implied, design firmly anchored above and sides. Attaching wire, string, or line appears invisible. Materials cannot actually or visibly touch the frame.

6. **"Bucket Brigade"** - Satellite design using two (2) containers connected with a curving line.
7. **"Water Bucket"** - In the Oriental manner showing water.
8. **"Bolt Bucket"** - Small Design more than 5" but not to exceed 12" in any one direction.
