1. No entry from the previous year can compete again.
2. Two entries per exhibitor in each lot unless noted.
3. See General Rules and Regulations regarding entries.
4. All ceramics must be fired.
5. Bottoms and backs must be finished.
6. No felt on the bottom.
7. Check stilt marks.
8. All lids and tops should be taped on, but judges will be permitted to untape them.
9. Sets of several items will be counted as 1 (one) entry.
10. All items to be judged should have exhibitors' entry ticket attached at lower right-hand corner.
11. **Class 325 and 326 are for Children and Youth Only. Please specify the age on the entry tag.**
