General Rules:

1. This is an official American Rabbit Breeders Association Sanctioned Show. As an official Sanctioned show, latest A.R.B.A. rules will govern the show. Filing of entry indicates acceptance of rules. A.B.R.A., P.O. Box 400, Knox, PA 16232. Sanction fee \$25.00.
Membership dues: Adults \$20.00; 3 years \$50.00; Combination husband/Wife \$30.00; Husband & Wife Family \$30.00 plus \$5 per child; 3 year, \$75.00 per family plus \$10.00 per child. Youth through age 18, \$12.00, 3 years \$30.00
While this is an A.R.B.A. show the exhibitor does not have to be a member of the A.B.R.A. to show. If after the show, the exhibitor wishes to be a member, they can register after the fact.
2. Rabbits will be authorized to be shown all week. If Rabbit is showing all week, entries are required at the Secretary's' Office between July 25 and August 8, 2022. Pre- registration is required to ensure there are enough cages. All weekly exhibitors are required to buy a weekly pass or a membership at a cost of \$30.00. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding their animal and keeping cages clean. **Rabbits entered in the Jr. Fair should not pre-register for this show. Jr. Fair Rabbits should only register the morning of the show.**
3. Rabbits will also be authorized to be carried in on the morning of the show. If Rabbits entered in Carry -in Show only, exhibitor must purchase a daily pass @ \$9.00 and pay a parking fee of \$5.00. The exhibitor will be authorized to drive on the fairground by entering gate #3 only. Parking will be behind the barns.
4. No Shipped In Stock. Carry In stock checked in by 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, August 27th, and released after the show.
5. All Stock must be permanently and legibly earmarked in left ear before arrival at show. Failure to comply will result in elimination.
6. Each rabbit must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor.
7. We reserve the right to refuse any entries that are not deemed to be in the best interest of the show.

8. Judging will start at **9:00 a.m. Saturday August 27th**. Exhibitors are responsible for getting their rabbit(s) to the show table. The Sandusky County Agricultural Society will not be responsible for loss or damage to stock during the show; however, precautions will be taken to eliminate danger and mistakes in the show area.
9. Entry fee of \$2.00 for single entry
\$2.00 for fur classes.
Meat pens entry fee \$2.00 for three rabbits.
Single Fryer entry fee \$2.00
Fees must accompany entry. No doe or litter class
10. Fur/wool Classes: White Breed Fur/Wool Class and Colored Breed: Fur/Wool Class
11. Ribbons will be awarded to fifth place
12. Premiums pad on all recognized A.R.B.A. classes and breed and Single Fryer Class
13. Class 51 Doe and Litter-Kits should be at least 5 weeks and no more than 8 weeks old by fair. **Mothers used for Doe and Litter class cannot be shown in any other class.**
